MARDI GRAS SAFETY TIPS AND LAWS

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Any person who is attending the Endymion Parade assumes all risk and danger incidental to Mardi Gras parades and festivities, including specifically but not limited to the risk of being struck by any artifact whatsoever which has been traditionally thrown, tossed, or hurled by the members of the krewe in the parade, including but not limited to beads, cups, frisbees, doubloons, trinkets and other favors, with the liability of this krewe and the members thereof in connection with any such loss or damage being limited by and in accordance with Louisiana law.

LAWS ON THE STREET

- * Open containers of glass or metal are not permitted.
- * Stay behind all barricades and cables. Do not throw anything at float and riders.

SPECTATORS

- * Do not climb trees.
- * Obey all laws pertaining to indecent exposure. (You will get arrested for exposing yourself)

SAFETY TIPS FOR SPECTATORS

A carnival crowd can take on its own personality; make sure your actions contribute to the fun, safety, and mystery of Mardi Gras and not to a disturbance that everyone will regret later. Do not run alongside floats for

throws—these beautiful floats are moving ten-ton vehicles and present life-threatening danger when the crowd surges forward. Piggy-backing is dangerous, you may get swept away by the crowd. Respect the directions of band and marching unit chaperones and the police. Move out of their way and allow them to perform for your enjoyment. Remember—if you get arrested, you are on your own. The bus will leave you!

- * Beware of pick-pockets and thieves. Be mindful of your surroundings and belongings at all times.
